Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of audited financial results of **Welterman International Limited** ("the Company"), for the quarter and year ended **31st March, 2026**, ("the Results") attached herewith being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('the LODR Regulations')

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial results:

- i. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the LODR Regulations in this regard; and

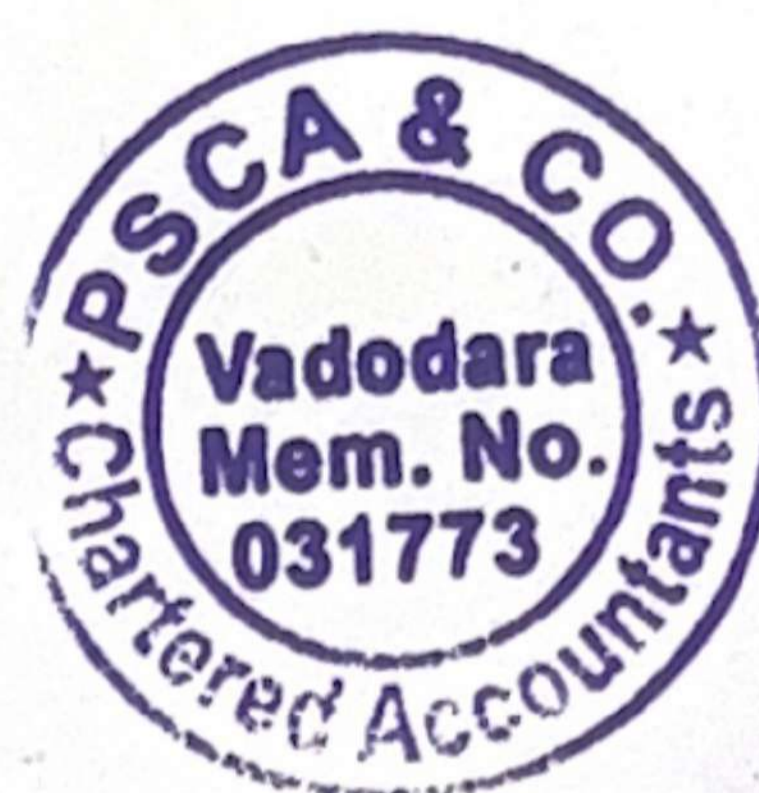
